

CE Dashboard

Vendor Partner Integrations

To further track your CE credits and streamline your CE experience, we've successfully integrated our system with STERIS, Pfiedler and Healthmark, A Getinge company. This seamless integration allows for the automatic transfer of your completed CE course data directly into your personal dashboard. Now, upon completion of eligible courses through our partner websites, your records will be updated in real time, eliminating the need for manual entry and ensuring accurate and up-to-date tracking of your CEs.

CIS Pilot

ADVOCACY UPDATE

Our advocacy and legislative efforts continue at the state and federal levels. Currently, we have certification legislation in two states and a federal initiative. Below is a summary of our state and federal initiatives.



Massachusetts - For the past 10 years, HSPA had legislation introduced in Massachusetts to require new Sterile Processing (SP) technicians* entering the profession to be certified and maintain continuing education. The legislation included grandfathering all current technicians in these roles, which means they would not have been required to obtain certification but would have been required to complete continuing education. Throughout these 10 years, our legislation passed through the Joint Public Health Committee. Healthcare Financing Committee, Senate Rules, Senate and House Ways and Means Committees, as well as the full House of Representatives and Senate. Unfortunately, our legislation again failed to pass in the last two-year legislative cycle. We had the support of the Massachusetts Hospital Association and numerous hospitals in Massachusetts, and we conducted several tours of Sterile Processing departments (SPDs) with legislators and their staff. Despite our efforts, nothing seemed to help us cross the finish line. We will not be reintroducing this legislation in 2025. We will attempt to pass it in other states before trying again in Massachusetts. *The bill language uses the term "central service technicians" because most state regulations use this term.

HSPA would like to thank the many members who dedicated their time and efforts to supporting and advocating for our Massachusetts legislation over the years.



Minnesota – Our certification legislation was introduced in 2023 and continues into this year (the legislative session began January 14 and ends May 19, 2025). We would like to express our gratitude to the SP team at M Health Fairview Hospital for providing a tour of their department to multiple state senators and representatives. These individuals were phenomenal at explaining and demonstrating the critical roles of SP professionals and how their work affects patient safety and outcomes. On April 2, 2025, our House bill passed in the Health Finance and Policy Committee and will be included in the House omnibus bill. On April 3, 2025, our Senate bill passed the Health and Human Services committee and will be included in the Senate omnibus bill.



Florida – This state has a 60-day legislative session that began March 4 and ends on May 2, 2025. We hope to have a committee hearing on our legislation this session, but we do not anticipate it passing this year. We have taken several legislators through an SPD in Miami and hope to schedule more tours with legislators in other parts of Florida later this year. We plan to reintroduce the legislation in 2026.

ADVOCACY UPDATE

Federal – We contracted with a federal lobbyist to represent HSPA in the push for the required certification of SP technicians in U.S. Veterans Affairs (VA) hospitals. In February 2025, the HSPA Board of Directors held meetings in Washington, D.C., and met with Congressional leaders to discuss the issue. HSPA requested a fiscal year 2026 appropriation for the Veterans Health Administration, requiring the VA to report within 90 days of the legislation's enactment the cost of certifying all SP technicians. Since the VA recently updated its training and certification requirements, only the SPS Chief, SPS Assistant Chief and SPS supervisory positions must meet certification requirements. Once we receive the cost data for all SP technicians to become certified, we can then introduce legislation that will provide federal funding for all SP technicians within the VA to become certified.

Sterile Processing Week Proclamations and Action Alerts

Thanks to everyone who participated in our 2024 Sterile Processing Week campaign. We had 416 participants, resulting in 2,702 letters sent to 1,326 elected officials to educate them about the profession and our dedicated week of honor. Be sure to look for more email alerts later this year. just ahead of Sterile Processing Week in October, and please take a moment to assist us with this important campaign.


